Wh - Questions

This is a term used to refer to one Question starting with *wh* or *h*

Who ----- Quién?	How ----- Cómo?
What ----- Qué- Cúal?	How many ----- Cúantos?
Where ----- Dónde ?	How much ----- cuanto?
Why ----- Porqué?	How far ----- Que tan lejos?
Whose ----- De Quién?	How long ----- cuanto tiempo?
When ----- Cuando ?	How often ----- con frecuencia
Which ----- Cúales ?	How old ----- Que edad

Wh-word	Information about...	Example
What	Things	What is this? It is a book.
	Name	What is your name? Roberth.
	Occupations	What do you do? I am a driver.
	Activities	What does she do? She is a journalist
Who	People	Who is the director of the school? Carlos Samaniego.
Where	Places	Where is he? In the house.
		Where does he work? In a school.
How	State	How are you? I am sad.
	Form / manner	How is Loja? It is small.

Questions with Do / Does



We use **Do** or **Does** to make a question in the simple present tense. * Exceptions: Questions with To Be and Modal Verbs (can, might, should etc.)

Auxiliary	Subject	Verb **
DO	I / you / we / they	go ... ? want ... ? like ... ?
DOES	he / she / it	

Affirmative: **You speak English.**

Question: **Do you speak English?**

Affirmative: **He speaks English.**

Question: **Does he speak English?**

** The base form of the infinitive = **to go, to need, to speak, to live**
 Look: Third person verbs lose the final "s" in questions

How to form the Present Simple Tense of the verb to work.
